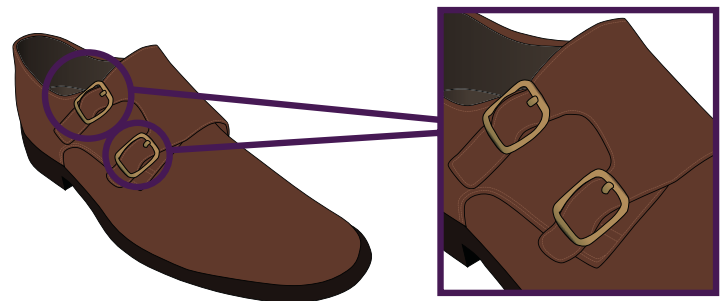


Bespoke Unit's Key Double Monk Facts

- Originally worn by European monks as early as the 1400's
- Offered in a wide range of colors and materials, which affects seasonality and formality

What Makes It A Double Monk?

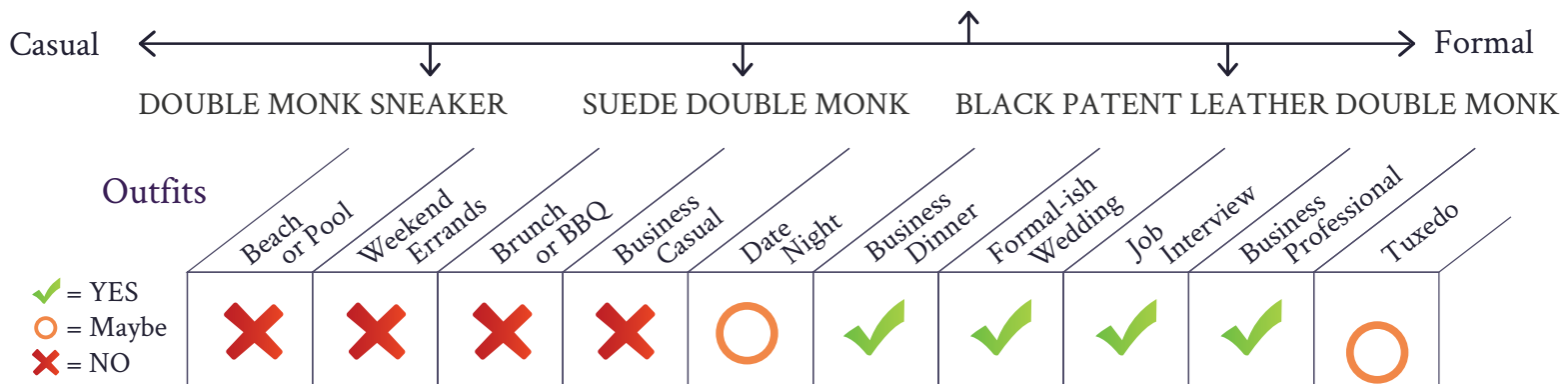
- Monkstraps are defined by buckle closures instead of laces. Double monks have two buckles.

Below is our "formality slider" for the double monk and its casual and formal variations

ARCHETYPICAL: BLACK/BROWN LEATHER DOUBLE MONK



- Double monks are typically black or brown leather and worn with tailored clothes
 - They can be worn more casually in a light-colored suede or even a sneaker
 - Double monks are in between an oxford and a blucher in formality
